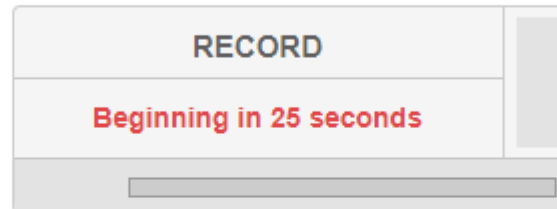
- Speak at a **normal speed** like you would during a conversation.

What is being asked?

This question asks the learner to listen to a sentence or short text and then repeat it.

What is being tested?

This question tests listening comprehension at the word and sentence level. It tests pronunciation and fluency. It tests if the words heard are understood and repeated accurately.

What is being asked?

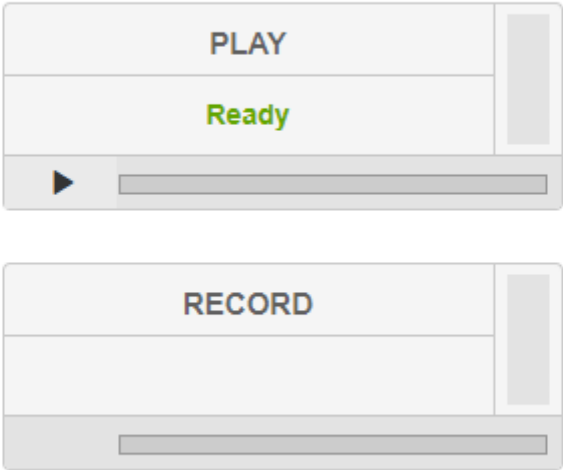

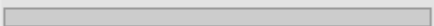
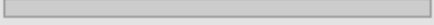
